Walk or Wheel prize packs

Rewards which are kinder on the planet!

In term 1 all registered kura will receive a Walk or Wheel prize pack. In 2026 we have a mix of new and old favourites. Use these as spot prizes at the gate, at celebrations or as rewards for meeting WoW challenge goals.

Packs include:

- Posters to promote Movin'March in English, Te Reo and Pacific Island languages *matua'ilelei tele!*
- Incentives such as stickers, stamps and the new WoW wallcharts.
- Notebooks, colouring pencils, new moptop pens, bookmarks and, back by popular demand, socks!

Please note, these are intended as prizes or rewards. We take a quality over quantity approach. We aim to provide a generous number, not one prize per student.



New WoW Challenge!

Out with passports – In with wallcharts! Enter class competition online

This year we're making a bold change – ditching the traditional WoW Passport cards! We've listened to your feedback and have an exciting change to the WoW competition. Introducing the Mā raro rānei, mā runga wīra rānei - Te wero mā te akomanga Walk or Wheel - Class Challenge Wallcharts!

How will this work?

Each class will get a WoW Wallchart and set of stickers and bookmarks.

Personal challenge:

- Each ākonga (student) sets their own whāinga (goal) to WoW (Walk or Wheel). Record your goal on a bookmark and take this home.
- 2. Use the WoW prize packs and stickers to reward students who meet their goals.

Class challenge:

- 1. Count how many WoW trips your class makes each day.
- 2. Challenge yourselves to beat your record or take on another class!

Learn – user guide and learning experiences:

- 1. Use <u>Te Haerenga o ngā Tamariki</u> to graph your results and learn more with Kura Kete resources.
- 2. Spark discussion around how our travel choices are linked to caring for our environment. Download the resource for Te Haerenga o ngā Tamariki on **Kura Kete**.

Regional Class Competition:

- 1. Each class chooses a week (5 consecutive school days) in the month of March as their 'challenge entry' and aims for the most possible WoW trips.
- 2. To enter the competition, you must register and enter your class trip data for that week on Te Haerenga o ngā Tamariki, tamariki.gw.govt.nz.

We think this new challenge will motivate students, while being more inclusive, engaging and easier on teacher's time. Plus, the data your class shares helps us to understand your students' needs and continue to improve our programmes.

Note: The Regional class competition replaces WoW Passport challenge competition. Entry is via tamariki.gw.govt.nz only. Travel data for 5 consecutive school days between 2-31 March 2026 must be entered to be in to win. Only one entry per class. Prizes are for the winning classes, not individuals. Six prizes to be won; three prizes for top entries and three random draw prizes. Entries close 20 April 2026. Winners drawn by 30 April 2026.

Bus trips count!

Travelling by bus is sustainable too. Students who use public transport can count these towards their WoW goals on the Wallchart. We suggest making time to walk or wheel on school grounds so all tamariki feel the benefits of active travel.

Park & Stride

Some whānau live too far away to walk or wheel. Schools can set up designated drop off points, **Park & Stride** or 'walking pou' so students can walk part of the way and still take part in the WOW Class Challenge.
